Outstanding Wildcat

Pablo Torrez, PHS student was recognized for being an outstanding Wildcat. He is a dedicated PHS student who is always willing to donate his time where needed. Pablo participates in soccer and Spanish Club, volunteers for the Adopt a Highway Program, and can always be counted on to raise and lower the flags for the campus each day.

Financial Report

David Atkeisson, Chief Financial Officer, stated that the District tax collections are currently 98%, which is 4% higher than at this same time last year.

Lawn Care and Landscape Services Contract

After evaluating operations to identify any needed efficiencies, the District identified that outsourcing lawn and landscaping functions would provide a cost and labor savings for the district and then issued a formal Request for Proposals. Palestine ISD received one response from Adam Kent Landscaping. The Board awarded a one-year renewable Lawn Care and Landscaping contract to Adam Kent Landscaping.

Qualified School Construction Bond

The Board of Trustees adopted a resolution authorizing a Qualified School Construction Bond that will enable the District to begin a Design-Build Project to provide needed physical improvements and technology infrastructure for all campuses. However, A.M. Story Intermediate and Palestine Junior High School will be priorities as all other campuses received the majority of the construction and renovations provided by the May, 2009 construction bond. The Board approved the resolution authorizing the QSCB with the provision that the Palestine community be afforded the opportunity to purchase bonds. The Qualified School Construction Bond will provide funds in the amount of \$6,420,000.00 that will be repaid over a period of 15 years with an interest rate of approximately 0%. This construction bond will not incur any tax increase for taxpayers.

Design-Build Firm Selected

The Board approved the selection of Buford-Thompson Construction Company as the Design-Build firm for the current Design-Build Project. Two companies submitted proposals and the District completed rubrics for each company to help determine which company would best serve the District. Buford-Thompson received the top score based on overall experience with the Design-Build process and a prior working relationship with Palestine ISD.

Independent Architect Selected for Design-Build Project

The Board approved the selection of Michael W. Marrs Architects to serve as the District's independent architect for the current Design-Build Project.

Summer School

The Board of Trustees approved ESL and TACE summer school programs. Transportation will be provided for students through 8th grade.

ESL Summer Program

ESL prekindergarten and kindergarten students must attend a mandatory summer school of 120 hours. The ESL summer school program will be held Monday, June 9th through July 7, 2014, 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at Washington Early Childhood Center.

TACE Summer Program

A TACE summer program will be held for 3rd grade students who do not pass the reading STAAR, 5th and 8th grade students who do not pass the reading and math STAAR and for any students enrolled in the TACE program. The summer TACE program will begin on Monday, June 9th and end July 17, 2014. Teachers will have a workday on Saturday, June 7, 2014, if needed. The TACE summer program for 1st grade will be held at Northside Primary, and grades 2-5 will be at Southside Elementary.

The TACE summer program for students in grades 6-8 and High School students who are currently enrolled in the TACE program, students who do not pass End of Course exams, and for students who are participating in credit recovery will begin Monday, June 9th and end July 17, 2014 and will be held at Palestine High School.

Policy EIF (Local) Revision

A revision to Policy EIF (Local) was approved, which affects academic achievement: graduation. The revisions to PISD policy are:

- Students entering prior to 2014-2015 may graduate under state programs, including the Minimum Program, the Recommended Program, and the AdvancelDistinguished Program, or the newly established foundation program.
- Options and the local district's requirements for the number of credits beyond the state's requirements:
 - The foundation program, without an endorsement (permitted only as authorized under state law and rules) requires 6 additional credits.
 - The foundation program with an endorsement requires 2 additional credits,

along with the successful completion of courses specified for each of the endorsements.

- The foundation program with a distinguished level of achievement requires 2 additional credits (Note: a student must eam a Distinguished level of achievement to be eligible for the 10% automatic admission to a state college/university.)
- State graduation credit in fine arts will not be awarded to participation in a community based fine arts program.
- State graduation credit in physical education will not be awarded for Note: participation in private or commercially sponsored physical activity programs conducted either on or off campus for students enrolled in high school for 2014-2015 and after.

In accordance with Texas Administrative Code § 74.62, graduation credit may be earned as a substitution for physical education through participation in drill team, marching band, and cheerleading. Physical education credit may be earned through participation in athletics.

2014-15 District Goals

The Board approved the following goals for 2014-15:

- Educate, Empower, and communicate with all stakeholders to increase STAAR scores and provide a solid foundation in the core academic areas with an emphasis on math/science and cross curricular writing skills to increase state assessment measures.
- Attract and retain a highly qualified faculty and provide all teachers with staff development that
 assures all state mandates regarding faculty training requirements and all priority district needs are
 met.
- Maintain a safe and orderly environment creating an atmosphere conducive to learning including facility upgrades to support a high quality learning environment.
- Increase positive attitude of School District throughout Community by fostering Community Partnerships.
- Implement HB 5 in order to foster innovative, collaborative learning experiences through district wide STEAM education, College Readiness, and CTE certifications.
